Training Synopsis

The National Center for Trauma Informed Care defines trauma as experiences that can be dehumanizing, shocking or terrifying, singular or multiple compounding events over time, and often include betrayal of a trusted person and a loss of safety. Trauma includes physical and sexual abuse, neglect, intergenerational trauma, and homelessness that induce powerlessness, fear, recurrent hopelessness, and a constant state of alert. Because trauma can impact one's spirituality, relationships with self, others, and community it is crucial to work from a philosophy of trauma informed care.

Healing is possible.

This training will teach participants about the concepts and applications of trauma informed care and moves from the question "What's wrong with you?" to one that asks, "What has happened to you?"

Who should attend?

Counselors, Therapists, Social Workers, Case Managers, Domestic/Sexual Violence Advocates, School Counselors, Clergy, Medical Personnel, and Administrators.
